The milk must be curdled, the whey-cheese must be boiled, and energy is needed to run the separator. Put on an apron and help to pack up the whey-cheese, weigh cheese and chase rats!
- Children's Energy play**
Using a waterwheel, air-, sunpower and your own muscle-power you can choose how much energy you want to produce. Come and learn how everything is connected.
- Children's Power plant and Log rafting**
Heavy logs are to be rafted from one lake to the other.
- Children's Railway**
Pretend to be a train driver, stoker, or curious passenger. If you are brave enough you can climb up the chimney on the engine. Guided rail bike trips at 13.00 and 15.00.

Welcome to a city that is growing at quite a pace! The railway has just reached the city, and in the J.P. Gulle general store, goods from the four corners of the world are sold. In the alley day-labourers and artisans live in cramped conditions.

Sheriff Kjell Herdell and his family live on a farm in Lillhärdaal in Härjedalen. Self-sufficiency is the order of the day, and the family produces everything it needs.

1956, Service station and driving school (Macken)

A trip down memory lane with a petrol pump, car, bicycle and motorbike workshops, a car showroom and a kiosk.

1895, Näsgråden, farm

The farmer Jöns Ol's and his family live in Ålsta in the parish of Näs. These are exciting times with many new inventions and ideas. Separators and harvesters facilitate work, while the temperance movement is becoming an important factor in social life.

1824, Gest House and Court (Tingshuset)

Every other 10 km, there would be an inn where visitors could switch to a rested horse. Before the hearing in the court, the accused could be put in custody.

1975, A modern society (Det moderna samhället)

Visit the family who has moved into their first house, the old age pensioners and the people who are trying to avoid modern life. The discovery park is based on a popular children's programme first broadcasted in 1973–1975, "Five ants are more than four elephants", with rights granted from SVT and the creators.

1895, Mountain farm (Fäboden)

Did you wonder where the live stock of Näsgråden were? At the summer pastures in the

ANCIENT TIMES

- 1. The Stone Age**
A little girl is cleaning fish in the Stone age exhibition, which describes how people in Jämtland and Härjedalen lived some 5,000 years ago.
- 2. Vikings and the Överhogdal tapestries**
The Överhogdal tapestries are the best preserved Viking tapestries in existence, and date from between 1040 to 1170 AD. As an introduction, there is a slide show about the tapestries, and an exhibition about the Vikings.

4. Wartimes

Between 1563 and 1720, Jämtland and Härjedalen were caught between Sweden and Denmark-Norway. The period ended in a disaster when King Charles XII's northern army was caught in a blizzard in the mountains and many thousands of soldiers died.

7. Aajeh – a Sami spring

A walk around the mountains will take you through the Sami year to experience Sami culture and reindeer herding. In the turf hut, you are invited to sit down to listen to a Sami life story, and below the mountain Nils Thomasson's beautiful Sami photos are on show.
